Guest Speaker for Oct. 12th:

Denay Hooks, Development Manager, Lubbock **Make-A-Wish** gave a very informative presentation of what Make-A-Wish really involves! **Denay** is new, as of Feb. '23, as Dev. Mgr., but has been with Make-A-Wish since 2019. **Denay** said the biggest misconception is that **M-A-W** is for terminally ill kids only. It was, but now also covers kids that have had a long battle with a disease or condition that has left them in dire shape but alive and with a future. These kids, and their care-giving parents, need relief from traumatic stress. **Denay** also said that the COVID years were not good for both donations and 'Wishes'. Currently Lubbock & the 20 surrounding counties have a backlog of nearly 50 Wishes! **Denay** also said that not every Wish costs about \$10,000! That cost is usually the max for exotic trips with parents, child & siblings. Many Wishes cost far less (ex. a cute playhouse, trip to a big city zoo, a really neat mechanized wheel chair and car carrier. **Denay** said most Wish Kids are 6-13, but Wishes can be granted for kids 21/2- 18. The Wish time-frame can be a year or more, but **M-A-W** has '**Rush Wishes**' that can come about in a lot less time with special local fund raising. Each kid has an application that needs to be filled out and vetted by the local **M-A-W** board. Funds come from grants, corporate donations and local fund raisers.
