Guest Speaker Last Meeting:

June 30, 2022

Floyd Mitchell, Police Chief, Lubbock Police Department since Nov. 2019, was our speaker, once again brought us up-to-date with facts and figures about our city.

Floyd said our city, all 135 sq. mi. of it, has a Census population of 257,141, but a current estimated population of nearly 269,000! County's estimated population is 330,000! Lubbock has really grown with many new businesses.

Three Neighborhood Police Stations are now operational. Located at 19th & MLK, Erskine & Quaker, and 124th & Indiana, all have identical floor plans and are meant to be neighborhood focal points. Each has a community meeting room and are available for tours 8-5 pm. Most of the 445 officers are assigned to these 3 stations, and are performing their 'beats' in that station's territory, so they get to 'know' the local citizens and businesses.

Lubbock, in the last 5 yrs., has seen a rise of violent crime, but a decline in property crime of nearly 11%. **Floyd** said joining Neighborhood Associations or initiating a **Neighborhood Watch** group on your block or cul-de-sac, and registering your Ring Camera with the Police Dept. **Safe Cam Program**, is a good way to reduce crime in the vicinity of your home.

Floyd said the Dept. is hiring more officers; next test date is July 23rd.
