Guest Speakers Last Meeting

Alex Yack, Senior Director of Development, TTU Col. of Ag Sciences & Natural Resources, brought Matt Williams, Assoc. Dir. of Development, and Robert Cox, Assoc. Dean of Academic & Student Programs, along with two students who have received a scholarship from the Boyd Fund Royalties Scholarship Fund, administered by our club.

Dr. Yack said the strength of Davis College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources at Texas Tech University lies in its ability to develop students with disciplinary understanding as well as personal and professional abilities to become leaders in the industries the college serves. A major focus of Davis College is to develop new knowledge, products and processes, thus enhancing the sustainability and the quality of life for Texans and others while at the same time delivering new information to the public.

We ask about the traits and qualities employers seek in new employees. We recognize that knowledge in a discipline is important, but it must be combined with the development of "soft skills." For example, can students work independently, can they work in a team, can they articulate a point, will they represent themselves and the company well? Guiding students to incorporate "soft skills" into their experiences and tool kit is an accomplishment of Davis College.

Dr. Yack then asked each of the students he brought to tell us about themselves and how their Boyd scholarship helped them. And did they!

Paul Rostad then presented **Dr. Yack** a check for \$15,010.44 that our club received the past year from royalties paid to the Boyd Fund Royalties account.
