Katie Reed Crump, Development Officer, **High Point Village**, Update on the Village. **Katie** started working at HPV in 2018 as a part of the Programs team before moving to the Development team. **Katie** has three kids and is married to a Lubbock Firefighter.

High Point Village, located at 6223 CR 6300 (N. Frankford) is a faith-based 501(c)(3) non-profit organization developed for the purpose of providing an enrichment facility and residential living community for individuals with special needs. **Katie** said their mission is to create a Village where individuals with intellectual disabilities can live, learn, work, worship, and achieve their full potential. **High Point Village** enriches the lives of individuals, age 8 & older, with special needs by providing a variety of vocational, educational, social, and motivational programs and activities.

Here are a few of the services that offered to Villagers.

'18 and Older Programs': **Reach High & Dream Big** that consist of:

- + Afternoon Enrichment classes
- + Music Therapy
- + Summer Camps
- + Various social parties throughout the year
- + Referral source that helps families obtain assistance

Katie said their oldest Villager is 67, youngest is 8. She told us about the fund raisers: 'Gallons for the Good' at Chick-fil-A restaurants, thru Sat. Sept. 2nd, and Slaton's 'Banana Pudding Fest' with Slaton Bakery's vanilla wafers, Sept. 2nd also. **High Point** will hold their **Annual Gala** on Nov. 9. There's a golf tournament TBA in June, '24. and invited us to attend, to help raise funds. Tuition for the Village is about \$700 a month, and for the Big Dream program, \$900 a mo. **Katie** also invited us to volunteer at the Village. Please call her at 698-0015.
