Guest Speaker Last Meeting!

Marie Froese, Owner, Y Knot Vineyard, Growing Organic Grapes & Other Crops. Marie became a U.S. citizen at 14, went to school in Texas, married Henry and has two children. In 2011 they moved to their 800 acre farm on Hwy 83, 3 miles E. of Loop in Gaines Co. In 2012, they started growing organic vegetables, which was hard to do because of all the pesticides/herbicides being applied on farms surrounding theirs. In 2014, their irrigation wells were drying up so they looked for cash crops requiring less water, and discovered, as did several farmers in the Brownfield region, that grapes do well. They planted 5 acres of grape arbors and in 2017 had their first full crop. In 2019, they didn't have enough buyers for their grapes so they obtained a license in 2020 to make their own wine. They built a winery and a tasting room will open this fall. Now with 11 acres of grapes, Cabernet-Sauvignon, Petit Verdot, Petit Shiraz, French Vertialis and Spanish Graciano grapes grown. They were able to have them certified 'organic', and use drip irrigation to conserve water. They intend to buy white grapes to make their own Cabernet Sparkling wine and blushes. They send their red grapes to **Bending Branch** winery in Comfort, TX. Bottled wines sold in Lubbock and surrounding towns. Contact Y Knot Winery at 432-847-9040, yknotfarms@yahoo.
