Guest Speaker for Nov. 2nd!

Sandy Fortenberry, Chair, Lubbock Historical Commission, came to speak but member Deborah Bigness was unable to attend.

Sandy brought to our attention that this Saturday will be the 105th Anniversary: Signing of the Armistice on the eleventh hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month, 1918. The Treaty of Versailles between Germany and the Allied nations was the official ending of the war.

Sandy said about 200,000 Texas men & 450 women nurses served in WWI. The Selective Service Act of 1917 required men 21-45 years of age to register for the draft.

Women representing most of the churches in Lubbock were involved in passing the Volstead Act resulting in passage of the 18th Amendment: Prohibition. This was repealed on Dec. 5, 1933, with the 21st Amendment.

Lubbock women were involved in Women's Suffrage (women's right to vote) which resulted in the 19th Amendment on Aug. 26, 1920.

Lubbock incorporated as a town on Mar. 16, 1909; with a census by 1910 of 1,938 people. The population reached 4,051 by 1920. The first hospitals, West Texas Sanitarium and Lubbock Sanitarium, the predecessor of Methodist Hospital, appeared in 1917. In 1916 the city council authorized the building of a city electrical plant, which in time evolved into Lubbock Power and Light. The Original Town boundaries: Ave. A & College Ave. E & W, and First St. & 19th St. N & S. Brick streets were laid downtown, and Texas Tech Technological
