Guest Speaker Last Meeting!

Andrea Carrillo & Susan McKay, Suicide Prev. Coord. / Social Worker Suicide Prevention. Susan said Andrea became ill & couldn't attend. Susan gave a combined presentation, though she said she wasn't up to date with suicide stats as Andrea was. Susan said she works primarily with Vets via the Veterans Administration's S.A.V.E. program: Signs, Ask, Validate, & Encourage/Expedite

VA **S.A.V.E.** is a skills training that provides information and steps that anyone can take when a Veteran may be at risk for suicide. Caregivers play an important role in suicide prevention and family and friends need to ask! VA S.A.V.E. training will help you act with care and compassion if you encounter a Veteran who is in crisis or experiencing suicidal thoughts. The acronym **S.A.V.E.** helps you remember the important steps involved in suicide prevention. Ask the most important question of all: "Are you thinking of killing yourself?" Anvone can call the '988' Hot Line! Susan stated that on average, 135 people are affected in some way by every suicide. Use the term 'died by', rather than 'committed'. 90% of people who survive suicide do NOT go on to die by suicide. Watch for signs: Hopelessness, feeling like there is no way out; anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness or mood swing; feeling like there is no reason to live; rage or anger; engaging in risky activities without thinking; increasing alcohol or drug use' or, withdrawing from family and friends.
