Tray Payne & Addison Barthold, Mayor / Asst. to the Mayor, City of Lubbock, 'State of the City'. Tray is Lubbock's 36th Mayor. He graduated from TT '96, Accounting, then '00 with a Law degree! Tray and his wife Heidi have 4 daughters in: Law school, TX Tech, HS and JH! Tray is also a practicing attorney in Lubbock.

Tray & Addison's slide show told us that Lubbock was first settled '89-'91, & had a population of 33 in '96, & 293 at the 1900 census! 2000 = 200,629; 2010 = 229,533; 2023 = 263,930! City was incorporated in '09 and had a City Charter in '17. In 1957 city was 30.5 sq. mi.; grew to 138 sq. mi. by 2023! Tech started in '23 and the Army Air Field was built in '41. 1970's = new Civic Center, Mahon Library, Canyon Lakes, So. Plains Mall.

Residential Permits: '18, just 130; '19-1,423; '20-1,920; '21-2,574; '22-2,556!

Commercial Permits: reached a high of \$818,769,616 for 2022!
