Guest Speaker Last Meeting

Shirley Green, a graduate of Estacado H.S. & TTU, with Masters from Wayland & UNT, is the Director of the **Roots Historical Arts Council**, established in 1978 in Lubbock, and now located at 1719 Ave. A. She brought several members of the **Council**. The organization's desire was to share the African American experience in the Early American West. This led to a committee to organize the first-ever re-enactment of Nolan's Staked Plains Expedition of 1877, where a troop of 10th Cavalry Buffalo Soldiers survived on the parched Texas Plains by drinking the blood and urine of their dying horses! The success of the re-enactment and the group's desire to share the African American historical and cultural experience with the region led to incorporation as a nonprofit arts and humanities organization.

The **Council's** first director was Dr. Rudolph Davis. **Council** presented numerous successful arts and humanities programs in the 1980's and the early 1990's. The activities included the State-Wide Tour of the Forgotten West Monument Replica, the Spring-fusion Talent Showcase, More Sky City Jazz Celebration, and numerous art exhibits. **Roots** awarded various arts and humanities scholarships to high school graduates. After his departure in the early 1990's, the Council engaged in limited arts programming and was almost dormant from 1995 until 2007. Then Eric Strong arrived! **MISSION:** The **Lubbock Roots Historical Arts Council** enriches life by promoting an understanding of the African American experience through the practice and appreciation of the visual and performing arts and through the study, interpretation, and preservation of the history of the African American in the Early American West. **Projects:** The Caviel Museum, Caprock Jazz Festival, Community Garden, First Friday Art Trail, East End Gateway, Community Revitalization Center & the Eric E. Strong Memorial Grove are on-going!
