PLEASE HELP RECRUIT A MEMBER!

Guest Speaker for Jan. 11th

Matt Rose, Pub. Affairs & Gov. Rel. Mgr. / Spokesperson for LP&L, gave an explanation on how to pick your new electrical power provider from 37 serving our city. **Matt** handed out 10-page copies of 'Retail Electric Competition – Customer Shopping Guide'. Go to the www.PowerToChoose.org website to get your own copy; and go to 'The Power to Pick is Here', they really help you to choose. But **Matt** says to first go online to obtain your 2023 electricity usage; or to your 2023 LP&L bills, and record the 'kilowatt hours' you consumed each month. Obtain the total and then see what months you used the most. Have electric heating?... the winter months may be highest. If you don't, then your summer months will always be the highest. **Matt** said the avg. TX home uses 1,000 KWhrs (986 KW - Lubbock). Don't procrastinate! **Matt** says you have until Feb. 15th to choose, or you will be randomly assigned to one of the 3 'default providers': Octopus Energy, Reliant, or TXU Energy, for the first 3 months. These three have Lubbock 'office sites'. **Matt** says you will start 'getting billed' March 4th, and your first 'bill' will go out in April. LP&L will bill you for their charge: about \$06.4 a KWhr for maintaining electrical infrastructure. **Matt** recommends that you choose a 12 mo. Contract to begin with (3-36 mo. Contracts will be made available by some providers), with different 'plans' to meet your needs. Save any ads you get in the mail for reference.
