Guest Speaker on Oct. 14th:

Chris Berry, President, Chapter 23: Lubbock Restaurant Assoc., and Mgr. of River Smith's, is married, has 3 children: one in Jr. College, 2 are Eagle Scouts! He is from El Paso where his parents started a restaurant in '68. Chris moved to Lubbock and formed a partnership with two others to own and operate River Smith's. Partner Paul runs the catering business and Chris the restaurant now. The third partner, Bob Corcoran (original owner River Smith's) is enjoying retirement.

Chris said the Rest. Assoc. has helped many local restaurants survive the Covid crisis, but so far 13 restaurants have closed this year. A couple of new ones have been added, however!

Chris said River Smith's closed Sundays for the 1st time in Mar. '21. River Smiths even sold groceries only for 3 wks, during the mandatory shut-down. He applied for monetary assistance to keep as many employees as possible (60-65 full & part-time).

Chris said problems now are:

- Many employees have left for Amazon or retail.
- No applicants, or just a few, for openings for months.
- Unemployment checks and assistance stipends.
- Left for higher pay/safety.
- Supply chain issues, lack of standard cat fish fillets, and increased costs. Had to raise menu prices 10%.

Nonetheless, River Smith's restaurant will prevail!
