Becky Robertson, Executive Director, Lubbock Impact, Inc., and former Key Club Member! was appointed E.D. upon former Kiwanian Rory Thomas succumbing to Covid. Impact's mission is: *Transforming lives, renewing minds, and educating families.*

Lubbock Impact has ministries and programs in the areas of Food, Clothing, Healthcare, and Spiritual Growth.

What started as a **soup kitchen** in 2007 has now grown to a ministry containing many different programs. Each ministry has a unique beginning where a volunteer or interested person(s) had an idea of how to help the less fortunate or those who had fallen on hard times. The **hygiene closet** began as one volunteer wanted to supply shampoo and sleeping bags to the homeless that she took sandwiches to each week at the library. Now the hygiene closet is completely full of necessity items and oversees a Christmas hygiene gift bag for over 400 people. The **med clinic** started as Trinity's pastor talked to his doctor about 'doing something' at Impact. Now the TTU Free Clinic is one of the finest in the nation of similar clinics. All the ministries at Lubbock Impact are free and help clients in the areas of food, clothing, healthcare, and spiritual needs.

In addition to helping the underprivileged of the community, Lubbock Impact is dedicated to breaking the bonds of generational poverty in children. This mission is what motivates the leaders of the ministry. Consistent biblical teaching, loving friendship and guidance, and intentional partnership with the families of our children and youth will make a difference.

In 2017, at the mark of the 10-year anniversary of Lubbock Impact, more than 98,000 meals have been prepared in the soup kitchen, almost 11,000 clients have been seen at the med clinic, and countless hearts have been touched by our programs, staff and volunteers.
