Art Teachers need additional funds to provide the various items and supplies for their students that go beyond the very nominal LISD art supplies. Prior to the establishment of this **Memorial Fund**, Art Teachers would often use their own money to purchase what was needed, as **David** did every semester, or their students went without. Art Teachers often ask their students to save toilet paper/towel rolls, newspapers, tissue cartons, etc., to bring to school for special projects. Items, like those, simply can't be purchased.

Each school's principal is notified of the money available in the account at the start of school & the new year, and told to inform their Art Teacher of the balance. In the event that one Art Teacher is over two schools, as David was, the funds of both those schools are pooled together for use.
