Prof. Alex Salter, Comparative Economics Research Fellow, Free Market Institute: **Inflation Causes**. **Prof. Salter** gave us 'the facts' and not the 'political fiction' on what actually causes inflation, which has been, and still is, worse, and ever 'really worse', in other developed countries of our world.

When oil/gas was cut off from Russia, we helped Europe, but our gas/oil prices went up. Federal Reserve raised interest rates to curb inflation: homes & cars financing costs went up... but inflation is 3% now!
